

Dear Parishioners

Radio Four's 7oclock news on Tuesday morning reported the unexpected death of Jack Duckworth. Later it broadcast his death scene. Vera, his wife who had died a few years ago, appeared in the room and asked Jack to go with her. Dilatory Jack didn't quite realise what was happening and so Vera called: "Come on, I'm waiting for you." Jack was later found dead in his chair. So, thumbs up, an acknowledgement in a soap that death is not the end of life. But now with some trepidation I await the funeral. Trepidation because I fear that it will be a 'celebration of life' and Frank Sinatra's "I did it my way" could well be played! The problem is: many TV viewers confuse soaps with reality and take the latest soap funeral as a model for a modern service. But fictional funerals do not provide the pattern for a Catholic service.

Celebrations of life look back. But while we do thank God for the life and the gift that a deceased was to family and friends, in Catholic liturgy our eyes are firmly fixed onwards and upwards, lifted by the wonderful promises of Jesus Christ that direct our gaze to eternity and everlasting life. Catholic liturgy supports the mourners by our shared faith, whilst accompanying the deceased with prayer.

Our practice of praying for our dead stretches back to the Old Testament and from its beginning the Church has honoured the memory of the dead with prayer, particularly during Mass. The first altars were the graves in the catacombs. The practice continued down the ages. On the eve of his execution St Thomas Moore wrote to his daughter Meg: "Farewell, my dear child, and pray for me, and I shall for you, and for all your friends, that we may merrily meet in heaven".

Is there a time limit to this prayer? No, our dead are outside of our world of space and time and so a prayer uttered 20 years after death is as relevant as a prayer offered at the moment of bereavement.

November is the month when traditionally we pray for our deceased relatives and friends, that with love purified they may enthusiastically enter God's embrace. Have you remembered to do so this month? Thomas Moore's prayer cannot be bettered: "that we may merrily meet in heaven". Annually the priests of the deanery concelebrate a Requiem Mass, particularly for all deceased priests who have served the deanery. Please do join us, on Tuesday, here at 11am and prayer for them and your own intentions.

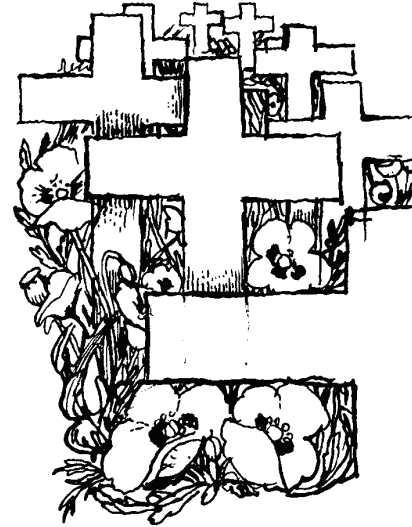
