

Dear Parishioners,

Some weeks ago I wrote about the introduction in September of the new translation of the Mass and explained some of the reasons for it, using the change in the response to the greeting at the beginning of Mass from “And also with you” to “**And with your spirit**” as an example.

The next change at the beginning of the Mass is in the Confiteor in the Penitential Rite. Older parishioners will recognise the return of a phrase that many grew up with: “**through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault.**” In our present translation this is abbreviated to a single “through my own fault.”

There are two main reasons for this change. First, the new translation is closer to the Latin original, and to what our fellow Catholics say in other languages. The second is that sometimes the words of the Mass are poetry – the repetition is all about a rhythm of words that is beyond simple speech, which will eventually, as we get used to the new words, speak to our minds and hearts in a different way.

The new version runs: “**I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.**”

There is also a change in another penitential formula, from:
Priest: Lord, we have sinned against you: Lord, have mercy.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: Lord, show us your mercy and love.

People: And grant us your salvation.

To:

Priest: Have mercy on us, O Lord.

People: For we have sinned against you.

Priest: Show us, O Lord, your mercy.

People: And grant us your salvation.

Finally, we shall be encouraged to use the Greek words, “**Kyrie, eleison**” (Lord have mercy) as a link with the days before the Latin Mass, when the Mass was celebrated in Greek!

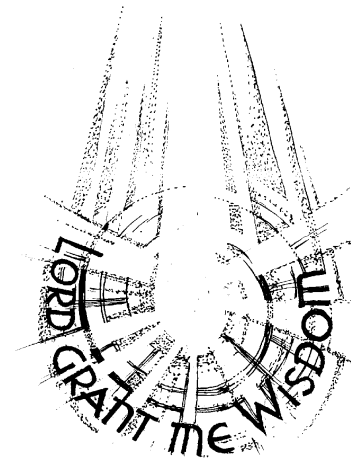
