

Dear Parishioners,

On 5th January the Falconer Commission on Assisted Dying published its Report. Yet despite the fanfare nothing has changed. The Report repeats the same claims and demands that the euthanasia lobby has been promoting for years. It is simply another step in the campaign which has already twice lost the vote in Parliament by a substantial majority.

Falconer's Commission is unbelievably biased in its membership. Of 12 members, nine were widely known as pro-euthanasia campaigners. As a consequence over forty organisations (including the British Medical Association) refused to appear before it or give evidence because of its obvious bias and campaigning aims.

So, to disguise its intention, the Commission's report treads softly: euthanasia should only be permitted if the patient has less than 12 months to live. This is the thin edge of the wedge! Repeatedly on TV and radio, the cases chosen to justify their demands are of people with long-term illnesses who would not qualify under this recommendation: cases of Motor Neurone Disease, Multiple Sclerosis, and other progressive illnesses that are guaranteed to terrify people. The fact that it is almost impossible for doctors to predict the length of life for any patient is totally ignored. The case of the Lockerbie bomber, Al Megrahi, exemplifies this.

Strict safeguards are also promised. Well, Holland has safeguards, yet each year around 1,000 of the 4,000 people undergoing euthanasia never requested it. Indeed Dr Els Borst, former Netherlands Health Minister and Deputy Prime Minister, the architect of the Dutch Euthanasia Law admits that it has led to a decline in the quality of the care of terminally ill patients and that now more should be done in Holland to protect "people who want to die naturally"!

No surprise that in this county every human rights disability group opposes euthanasia.

Anglican priest George Pitcher advises anyone who doubted the ultimate aims of the Commission to look at the evidence presented by Joyce Robins, the co-director of patient concern. She told Falconer: 'I think we can only go for terminal illness at the moment, so this doesn't actually apply to the people who are probably about to go into care homes. But, you know, baby steps.'

They never give up and neither should we!
