# Dear Parishioners

After seven weeks the work of refurbishing the sacristy will be completed when the floor covering is laid on Wednesday. It has taken much longer than anticipated due to the perished state of the plaster on both the walls and ceilings which simply fell away once the work began. A leak in the roof which has been patched many times over the past decades demanded the removal of the slates. renewal of the supporting woodwork and replacing the troughings. On the positive side the renovations offered the opportunity to redesign the whole sacristy area to provide adequate storage for vestments, servers' albs, cleaning materials and all the other bits and pieces that a functional church requires.

The door between the church and the sacristy is now fitted with a keypad. Opportunistic thieves have targeted a number of presbyteries by simply walking into sacristies during Mass and through to the presbytery before escaping with their ill-gotten gains. No one ever thinks of challenging a person entering a sacristy! The number operating the pad is not a secret – the servers know it – but it should deter thieves.

Sabden's new bell was hung on Monday and daily rings the Angelus at 9am, 12noon, and 6 pm. On Friday it was tolled for the first time for Alice Parkinson's funeral.

There will be an ecumenical 'Advent Service of Light' in St Mary's Sabden at 4pm on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> December. While adults are in church, children will have their own service in the hall during which they will decorate lanterns before processing into church to join their parents.

Sabden St Marys will hold their own Advent services on the first three Tuesdays of Advent at 7.30pm.

St Michael and St John's has an 'Advent Service of Light' on Sunday 16th December at 4pm which will also involve our school and First Communion children with lots of candles and lanterns.

The annual Rotary Clitheroe Civic Carol Service will be hosted this year by our parish and school on Wednesday 13th December at 7pm.
