

Dear Parishioners, What a great night we had on Friday! I thought that the days of good old parish functions, those we remember from 30 or more years ago were a thing of the past. But no; given a reason for celebration we are still able to come together as a community and celebrate. May we dream up more reasons in the near future!

Friday night also demonstrated the potential of the refurbished Parish Centre. Wait until the new pictures are hung!

Even before I arrived in Clitheroe, I received an email listing the problems facing the "parish club" and requesting my immediate attention. On my arrival individual parishioners pleaded that I keep the club open. Since then the separate entities of parish club and hall have been amicably and successfully amalgamated into one Parish Centre and the buildings have been refurbished. But despite much hard work it is still unable to pay its way. So some months ago when the debt reached £30,000 the Parish Centre Committee was faced with a stark choice: closure or expansion to a professionally run commercial venture. We chose the latter. On Tuesday we took a further step of joining a consortium of Catholic parish centres and clubs that have already demonstrated that this option can work.

As you leave church today you will be asked to take a publicity leaflet that lists some of the Party Packages on offer. We have a range of similar options including family receptions following funerals.

But, but, but, to succeed we need your support. Spread the word, share these leaflets with friends and please do consider hosting your own celebrations or receptions here in your own Parish Centre. I doubt you will find better deals elsewhere.

Last Friday's celebration fell on the feast of St Vincent de Paul and at the Mass I mentioned the need for volunteers to join our SVP group who quietly do so much good in the parish helping people in need even if that need is simply for a visit. Sadly two of our very active members, Rae Carter and Peter Tomlinson died recently, and infirmity has curtailed the action two others. We need volunteers to continue this vital Christian work. Do consider volunteering – you decide how much time you can give.

A similar problem faces our great cohort of church cleaners. Can you replace for example, Betty Brown, by offering one hour on Monday mornings?

We are a parish community, we all live busy lives but we cannot afford to wait around while others do or do not volunteer in our stead.
