

## Dear Parishioners,

As a Catholic school our mission at St Michael and St John's is to serve and to make Christ known through our work with our children, families, parish and Diocese. 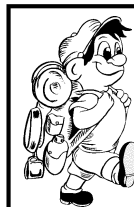
