Dear Parishioners

Every Sunday as we recite the Creed we say: "I believe in the Communion of Saints." What does that mean?

The 'communion of saints' is made up of all people who have placed their hope in Christ and belong to him through Baptism, whether they have already died or are still alive. It is composed of people like you or me, as also of all who have gone before! In Christ both the living and the dead are one Body; we live in a communion, in a relationship that encompasses heaven and earth.

So, Church members are not only the living but also those who have died (whether they are still undergoing a process of purification or are already in the glory of God), individuals known and unknown, great saints and ordinary folk. And because we are one body we are able to help one another even beyond the grave. We can call for help and support on our patron saints after whom we are named, other saints whom we may admire, as also our departed relatives and friends whom we believe are already with God. Equally, by our prayers for them, we can come to the aid of our dear departed who possibly are still undergoing purification.

On Wednesday of this week, 1st of November we celebrate the Feast of All Saints. This is a Holy Day of Obligation, which means if we are able to get to Mass then we should. Mass will be celebrated at:

9.15am, St Michael & John's, Clitheroe11.00am, St Mary's, Sabden6pm, St Hubert's, Dunsop Bridge

On Thursday, 2nd November, we celebrate 'All souls'. Our dead are outside of this world of space and time and so our prayers for those who have died are as relevant today or tomorrow as at the moment of their death and their meeting with God. Mass will be celebrated in St Hubert's, Dunsop Bridge at 9.15am.

The Feasts of All Saints and All Souls remind us of our relationships within the communion of God's family, and that living or dead, we rely upon each other for help.
