### A Message from Pope Francis

Pope Francis has urged Christians to intensify their prayer, penance, and fasting for the situation in Afghanistan. "In historical moments like this we cannot remain indifferent. As Christians, this situation commits us. I entrust the dead to the mercy of Almighty God and I thank those who are working to help that people so tested, especially the women and children. I ask everyone to continue to assist the needy and to pray that dialogue and solidarity will lead to the establishment of a peaceful and fraternal coexistence and offer hope for the future of the country.

**An Afghan's Prayer** 'Great God On High I know you are there, somewhere, but I need to see you now, right by my side, to hold and guide me and wipe away my desolation. I have lost everything but You and those that I love, and some can only be a memory now. So many hearts ceased to beat, so many hearts torn apart! So many with terror hanging over them! No home, no possessions, no job, no money, no future, entrapped without hope. Many have escaped but it doesn't feel like freedom, we are shocked and broken with our children looking at us for food, shelter and happiness we can't provide, we are so very far from home in body mind and spirit.

Blessed Lord we have been taught by those that have suffered for you before us over so many generations and shown us so much of You. Help us to grasp their vision and feel you closer as we strive to rebuild and make new neighbours, new friends.

We pray for the mercy of those in power over us, for all councils and all people to give of themselves in our plight that we might recover and repay a society that cares. We believe in good things and worked against tyranny in our own ways, please Lord, grant us a welcome, a safe home and a peace that lasts.'

You embrace with your tenderness all that exists.

Pour out upon us the power of your love, that we may protect life and beauty.

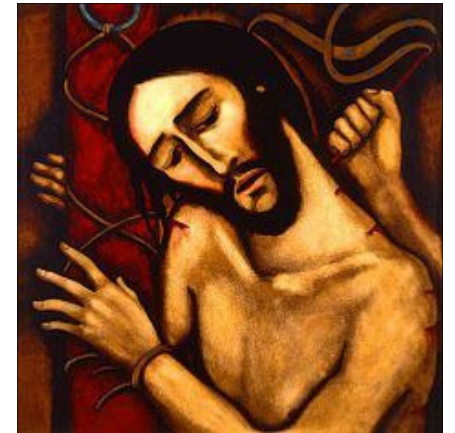

**ASSISTED DYING BILL** This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to pray this Bill is defeated, write to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and share our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media. **AFGHANISTAN APPEAL:** Latest from Caritas. The appeal has been fast moving. Caritas are still able to gratefully accept the donated items already collected, but we are now politely asking everyone that no further appeal to source items is made just for the time being please.

For context, Caritas was chosen to help the local authorities in providing practical support for the moment evacuees from Afghanistan began to land in the region. Those 'on the ground' now inform us that the immediate needs have been met, and they are now in the process of assessing the specific needs of individuals and their families, and then requesting only the exact items they need from us.

Our staff and volunteers in our various drop-off centres, are currently sorting through items and arranging deliveries based on these specific requests. Space for storing items is, of course, limited—but nothing will be wasted.
