DIACONATE ORDINATION next Saturday 18th June, one of our parishioners, Damian Buggie from Sabden, will be ordained to the Permanent Diaconate. Damian along with three others will be the first permanent Deacons to be ordained for the Diocese of Salford. The ceremony will take place in Salford Cathedral at 12.30pm, and anyone is welcome to attend. Let us keep Damian in our prayers.

WHAT IS THE PERMANENT DIACONATE? Deacons have played an integral part of our faith community since the earliest days of the Church, when the apostles appointed men to help care for the communities around them. The work of deacons is based on three key areas: the Ministry of Charity, the Ministry of the Word, and the Ministry of the Altar. Deacons can baptize, witness marriages, perform funeral and burial services outside of Mass, distribute Holy Communion, preach the homily, and are obligated to pray the Divine Office every day. Deacons will also often have a career outside the Church, which they can continue throughout their ministry.

For those of you who are wondering how Weld Day came about, here is a short history. Thomas Weld (1750-1810) is the person who gave us the land on which we built our church. He was a member of the English Catholic gentry, landowner and philanthropist. In 1798 he presented us with land here on Lowergate so that a church and a school could be built. Part of a letter from him regarding the gift of the land states "*I shall certainly be very happy to give the ground where on to build the Chapel at Clitheroe, upon condition of perpetual anniversary mass for both Mrs Weld and myself after our decease*". Weld Day is held on the first Sunday in July, in the garden in front of the Presbytery. All three parishes, Clitheroe, Dun-sop Bridge and Sabden are involved. Mass in the garden at 10.30am (to be confirmed) and is followed by a picnic.
