LIVE SIMPLY THOUGHT OF THE WEEK Climate breakdown is one of the biggest drivers of water shortages and is expected to heap even more pressure on our depleting supplies. People in England are facing shortages by 2050 unless we save water fast—according to the UK Environment Agency. So please think carefully about how you use water, especially in the garden.

1. Using a watering can in the garden instead of a sprinkler or a hosepipe. Garden sprinklers and hose pipes left running can use between 500 and 1,000 letres of water an hour.

2. Think about fitting a water butt to collect rainwater off your roof. Water buffs usually store about 200 litres of water. As well as being better for watering your plants, using rainwater in the garden reduces the amount of treated water you use.
