LIVE SIMPLY—THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK: Are you an Ethical Consumer? Being an ethical consumer means buying products which were ethically produced and /or which are not harmful to the environment and societv. This can be as simple as buying free-range eggs or as complex as boycotting goods produced by child labour. Products which fall into the ethical category include organic produce, fair trade goods, energy-efficient light bulbs, electricity from renewable energy, recycled paper and wood products with Forest Stewardship Council approval. Being an ethical consumer can also involve watching your food miles: how much energy was used getting the product to you. For this reason, ethical consumers are encouraged to buy products which were produced locally. Find out if there is a farmers' market, or an allotment society near you where you can purchase products. Successful campaigns waged by ethical consumer movements have popularized dolphin-free tuna, foods that are free of genetically modified organisms (GMOs), sweatshop-free clothing, fair-trade coffee, cosmetic products free from animal testing, and conflict-free diamonds.

<u>CAFOD—FIX THE FOOD SYSTEM</u> Farmer's seeds under threat. For generations, small scale farmers have freely swapped and shared a wide variety of seeds and more recently developed seeds that are more resilient to a changing climate. However, their right to choose what seeds they us is under threat. Laws are being introduced across the world to limit what small farmers can do with their seeds. These laws, backed by large institutions, like the World Bank, overwhelmingly favour large businesses. Small scale farmers will be forced to purchase commercial seeds. Protecting the freedom of

farmers to choose their seeds is a right we must all stand up for. **On the weekends of 1st & 2nd July and 8th & 9th July**, we will be holding a petition signing event in support of small scale farmers which will be presented to the President ahead of the World Bank's Annual Meeting in the autumn. **Please come and support.**
