A brief re-construction of the handover of keys and title deeds undertaken by civic leaders, will be followed by a repeat of the words used a century ago by the civic leaders of the day. The event will then continue at the War Memorial with an explanation of the circumstances regarding the purchase and the design and construction of both the statue and the Scottish granite plinth upon which he stands. There will be a reading of poems from the time and the laying of a wreath made of white lilies to faithfully repeat what was done on the day of the original dedication.

Although the purpose of this event is to pay tribute to the achievements of all those involved 100 years ago, there will be a modern day twist as the current town council and borough mayors will be assisted in the re-enactment and by direct descendants of the principal parties involved'
