By way of a brief overview, the headline details show that thanks to the generosity of parishioners, the finances of the parish remain relatively healthy as we move into a period of essential building maintenance.

Although the surplus figure for 2023 is considerably lower than in 2022, the difference has principally been created as a result of a decrease in legacies and an increase in repairs and maintenance spending.

The parish property consists mainly of old buildings, old cemeteries and old trees, all of which create expenditure. Parish buildings have been subjected to detailed structural surveys as a result of diocesan requirements. This has been an expensive operation and now the parish must move into the repair and maintenance phase, which will be costly, but necessary.

Your continued support is really appreciated in these challenging times.
