# 4. Agenda (Margaret Donnelly)

#### 5. Year of Faith

Pope Benedict has called for this to be celebrated from October 2012 to November 2013. Special Liturgies and events will be organized throughout the deanery. We will aim to regenerate a pride in our faith and in our history, John Southworth is our local martyr.

In each parish of the deanery we aim:

- To train, accredit and commission laity to conduct funeral and particularly crematoria committals.
- To train, accredit and commission teams of laity (3 per team) to conduct Eucharistic Services on weekdays who would be able, in an emergency situation when a priest is unavailable, to conduct a Sunday Service. An agreed format of service will be used in all parishes.
- To train, accredit and commission teams of laity to support bereaved parishioners.
- To stimulate the promotion of priestly vocations by clergy with an emphasis on the responsibility of laity in this task.
- To use the more accessible YOUCAT in parishes to strength the faith as the basis for all activity. (To negotiate a price reduction for 2,000 copies)
- To discuss the possibility of a Permanent Diaconate ministry.
- To explore with the schools the "anti-practice culture" evidenced within

our schools and ways to support and encourage teenagers who continue to practice.

• To find ways of inviting the estranged to "come home to God."

#### 6. Culture of Silence before Mass

Fr. John introduced this with a quotation from Thomas Merton and the story of one atheist's experience of silence and prayer. The opinions of the meeting were divided, some strongly for silence before Mass, others very concerned that we would loose the warmth and welcome that we now have in SSMJ. After discussion, Fr.John told the meeting that this will tie in with the Year of faith and we will enforce it then.

# 7. Special Ministers of Holy Communion

A course for Eucharistic Ministers will be led by Frankie. All ministers must attend both parts.

Part A Thurs July 5<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm or Saturday July 7<sup>th</sup> at 3pm.

Part B Thurs July 12<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm or Saturday July 14<sup>th</sup> at 3pm.

Some discussion took place re the need for more Ministers at Sabden.

#### 8. Readers

A course is to be arranged for all readers in the near future.

#### 9. Times of:

First Holy Communion: arrangement in Sabden to remain the same. This year because of Mass times First Communion took place at SMMJ's at 2pm after the children's "breakfast". Meeting agreed that next year First Communions are on a Saturday allowing the children time for family celebrations etc and then children come to Sunday Mass in their First communion outfits, receive Holy Communion and are introduced to the parish. Frankie suggested a Blessed Sacrament procession. This to be discussed further at a later meeting.

**Confirmation:** arrangements for this will remain as this year in both Churches.

### 10. Weekday Mass times

Sheila Shore had written to Fr. John requesting later weekday Mass times. There was a request for one weekday evening Mass but this is difficult for Fr. because of meetings. Decision was to leave times as they are at present. Fr. John will give this further consideration.

#### 11. Cemetery Mass

Aug. 27<sup>th</sup> at 10am in the old cemetery. Mass will be celebrated for all deceased friends and relatives. Council are unable to take over this cemetery until the last three graves are occupied.

Right to life Walk is at 1pm on that day.
